Recycling is confusing!



Household trash should only be placed in the large green receptacles provided by the Borough and placed to the curb anytime after 6pm the evening before your scheduled pick up and no later than 6am the morning of the scheduled pick up. Please DO NOT place recyclables, bulk, hazardous waste, dirt, and/or grass in this container. There will be no pick up on New Years Day, Thanksgiving, or Christmas or the days in which they are observed.

Curbside Recycling

**East Side of Rt 35

THERE IS NO PICK UP ON THE 5TH WEDNESDAY OF ANY MONTH

Recycling should only be placed in *blue* receptacles provided by the Borough and placed to the curb anytime after 6pm the evening before your scheduled pick up and no later than 6am the morning of the scheduled pick up. Please keep items loose in the receptacles and not in plastic bags. Please DO NOT place household trash, bulk, hazardous waste, dirt, and/or grass in this container. There will be no pick up on New Years Day, Thanksgiving, or Christmas or the days in which they are observed.

Tips For a Cleaner Recycle Stream

All containers should be rinsed and dried with labels removed prior to going into the recycle bin.

Caps off of pourable bottles

Keep all plastic bags out of the recycle bin

No liquids

When in doubt, throw it out

Leaf & Brush Collection

Leaves will be collected April-June and October-December. Leaves may be bagged however, must be in paper biodegradable bags. LEAVES IN PLASTIC BAGS WILL NOT BE COLLECTED.

Brush should be cut into 4 foot lengths and no wider than 24 inches. Brush does not need to be tied. Please keep all brush and leaves in separate piles no closer than 10 feet from any storm drain.

No grass clippings will be accepted.

Bulk Trash

Examples of bulk items collected for disposal include but are not limited to:

- ◆ **Furniture**
- ◆ **Small wood (four foot maximum length)**
- ◆ **Appliances**
- ◆ **Metal**
- ◆ **Glass (should be taped in an X shape to help prevent shattering)**
- ◆ **Electronics**

There will be no bulk pick ups in February, November or December. Bulk items do not include construction debris, hazardous waste, or full move in/outs. Please see Borough Ordinance 14-2024 for more information.

The operations of the Monmouth County Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Facility is contracted out to Radiac Environmental services.

The hours of operation for household hazardous waste drop off at the facility will be as follows:

Materials accepted are motor oil, antifreeze, gasoline, pesticides, fertilizers, herbicides, paints, solvents, thinners, varnishes, pool chemicals, propane barbecue tanks, and cleaners. All materials must be in marked containers with original labels.

Residential Latex Paint is NOT Hazardous Waste. Please dry out cans and dispose with your regular household trash collection. DO NOT dispose of cans where the paint is not dried. Wet paint can be brought to Monmouth County Household Hazardous Waste Facility.


Batteries- Monmouth County has advised municipalities that household batteries such as Carbon-zinc and Alkaline (AAA, AA, A,C,D, and 9-Volt) should now be disposed of with regular household trash. All rechargeable, button and car batteries can be brought to Monmouth County Household Hazardous Waste Facility.

Fluorescent tube lighting will no longer be collected with bulk trash and/or at the recycling center. Fluorescent tube lighting can be brought to Monmouth County Household Hazardous Waste Facility. Please Contact a local Home Improvement Store such as Lowes or Home Depot for recycling information on all CFL light bulbs.

Medical Waste- DPW does not collect or handle any type of medical waste. Items such as needles and/or syringes should be taken to a local hospital. Sharps and/or needles can be placed in empty milk/juice containers and sealed, labeled and placed in trash.

Snow Removal

The primary objective of snow plowing is to open roadways for traffic. PLEASE MOVE YOUR CAR OFF THE STREET in order that snowplows can effectively remove snow from the roadway. When shoveling out your driveway, shovel out a pocket on the side of the driveway nearest to approaching traffic. The accumulated snow on the passing plow will fill the pocket instead of the entrance to your driveway. Please note that the DPW will continue plowing during the entire snowstorm and after until the streets are cleared to the edge of the roadway. This is essential in order that emergency vehicles can pass and we can prepare for any additional snowfall. You may have to re-open the end of your driveway more than once. **When clearing your sidewalks and driveways, DO NOT throw snow into the street. This hinders plowing and impedes the safe flow of traffic.**



Potholes

Rt. 35, 36, 71 (Broad St.) are state roads and should be reported to (609)-588-6212.

Tinton Ave., Hope Rd., and Wyckoff Rd., are county roads and should be reported to (732)-431-6550.

All deliveries will be made on Wednesdays (April- October) unless otherwise noted from the Borough.

Tree Trimming or Removals

Residents requesting tree removal & trimming requests should forward the completed Tree Removal/Tree Trimming Application, that can be found on the Borough webpage or by emailing DPW, to The Zoning Department (47 Broad St. Eatontown, NJ) prior to any work being done to said tree. Once the application is received, the zoning department is allowed ten (10) working days to process.

Why We May Not have Picked Up

- **Brush – Must be no longer than four feet in length. *The Borough will not pick up Grass Clippings.***
- **Paint Cans – Latex Paint Cans – Must be dried and placed in garbage cans.**
- **Household Hazardous Waste – Not picked up by the Borough. Please contact Hazardous Waste Facility (732) 683-8686.**
- **Plastic Bags for leaf disposal – No longer picked up per Ordinance #15-2001.**
- **Propane Tanks — Not picked up by the Borough. Please contact Hazardous Waste Facility (732) 683-8686.**
- **Yard Waste – Shall not be placed closer than ten feet to any storm drain inlet per Ordinance #281.13.**
- **Garbage Cans – Are for household garbage only. No bulk trash or any other debris**
- **Bulk Trash – Different materials are to be separated from one another for efficient pick up. Please see Borough Ordinance 14-2024 for more bulk information.**

Storm Water Pollution



What is storm water?

Water from rain and melting snow that flows over lawns, parking lots and streets is known as stormwater runoff. This water, which travels along gutters, into catch basins and through storm drain pipes and ditches, usually is not treated, but then flows or is discharged into local waterbodies. Polluted stormwater can kill fish and other wildlife, destroy wildlife habitat, contaminate drinking water sources and force the closing of beaches because of health threats to swimmers.

How does it get polluted?

Along the way, the storm water picks up trash (fast-food wrappers, cigarette butts, Styrofoam cups, etc.) and toxins and other pollutants (gas, motor oil, antifreeze, fertilizers, pesticides and pet droppings).

How Can I help Prevent it?

- ⇒ Limit your use of fertilizers
- ⇒ Do not apply fertilizer if heavy rain is predicted
- ⇒ Clean up after your pet-dispose of pet waste in trash or unwrapped in toilet
- ⇒ Do not litter. Wait until you see a receptacle
- ⇒ Keep leaves and grass out of storm drains by placing them no closer than 10 feet from grate
- ⇒ Use natural or less toxic alternatives
- ⇒ Get your car washed where the water gets treated and recycled
